The eHUBS consortium is proud to share its fifth newsletter with you!

Shared electric mobility gaining momentum!

As revealed in our newsletter 4, the eHUBS project succeeded in securing additional funding to pilot in three more regions (Dublin, Inverness and Wallonia). In this newsletter, the new pilot partners introduce the pilots to you. They are already advancing in organizing the eHUBS and hopefully already early 2022, the first eHUBS in the new pilots will be operational. Furthermore, the digital integration of the new hubs with MaaS providers started. The preparations went a lot smoother compared to the 'old' pilot partners as the new partners made use of the experiences of the existing partnership.

But there is more news as we added a new partner to the project: Deelfiets Nederland. They act as sub partner of Urbee and will introduce a more robust e-bike sharing system in the cities of Nijmegen and Arnhem. The remaining Urbee bikes are moved to Leuven. The eHUBS project thus is progressing well to introduce more shared and electric mobility to North West Europe. In total, we expect to have started more than 130 eHUBS with 770 EV's and 1,600 Light Electric Vehicles.

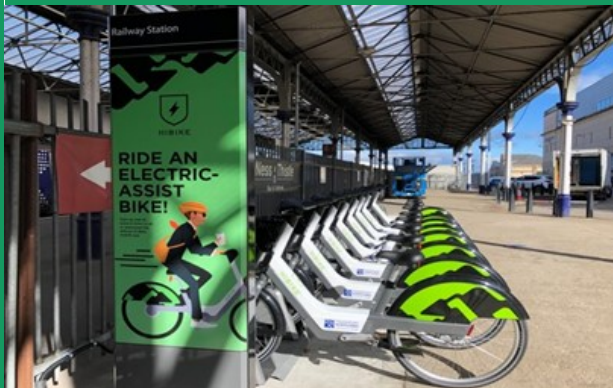

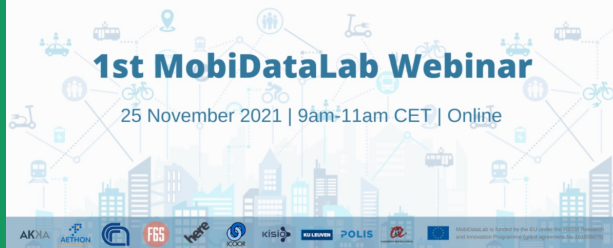
