It has been a turbulent time navigating through the effects of the pandemic, which saw much of our meetings confined to screens. Surveying the trade required face-to-face meetings and exploring salvage yards to gather crucial information, which allowed us much needed escape from computers. The launch of the Truly Reclaimed label will further the reuse economy by giving voice to the vast amount of reclamation and reuse that is often unnoticed. Truly Reclaimed began life in 2012, but it wasn't until the FCRBE project that we could bring the concept to fruition. By linking products to protocols and allowing people to easily see the stories behind reuse, Truly Reclaimed builds trust and promotes the work of the reclamation industry.
