






Rent Supplementation by the State in the Private Rental Sector






















GHG A1-3 Carlow per construction type and % of improvment



Barriers...





- Government (Local and Central) is driven by policy, which is usually reactive not proactive
- Funding is restricted to defined limits within the Irish Housing Department
- The Department also has approved levels of specification, beyond which they are reluctant to go...
- Innovation is usually seen by State agencies as higher risk
- Reluctance to be the "first" to deliver something new
- Donegal Mica Emergency...
 - ~10,000 homes, Estimated cost >€3billion
























Climate Change IRELAND

- Challenging politically!









Don't do it on your own – collaborate, share bubbles, Multi disciplinary








Policy





- 1. EPBD: by adapting more energy efficiency the embodied CO2e emissions of the building material and the construction phase become more in focus as a potential to save CO2e emissions.
- 2. Green Deal: gain more savings in CO2 emissions gain support by EU Taxonomy
- 3. Bank, investment and insurance industry sees climate change as a risk factor and support schemes that reduce CO2 emissions
