Origins

Project emerged from associations working in disadvantaged neighbourhoods.

Support from the BrusselsCapital regional government who subsidised a feasibility study.


CLTB created in December 2012.







Structure



Shared democratic governance – Three tiers including inhabitants, civil society, and political authorities.

Two legal entities – A Foundation and a non-profit organisation.






Target Public

Acquisition of new or renovated flats by households eligible for social housing – Four different categories based on income.

Emancipation plays a crucial role – Community-building is central to CLTB.







Financing Model

Housing production subsidised by Brussels-Capital Region who allocates funding for the acquisition of land and the construction of housing units.







Current Status



Housing projects:

- One completed project (9 households)
- Three projects in construction (43 units)
- Five projects in preparation (77 units)

Members:


- More than 400 (candidate) owners
- Around 170 supporting members
