The Maturity gap of Circular Building Technology

The regiodeal in the Parkstad region in the south of the Netherlands consists of the subtraction from the market of 10,000 dwellings and 120,000 m2 retail and utility floor area and the Dutch national ambition is to have a fully circular economy in 2050. Two challenges that have a close interconnection by re-using and recycling the subtracted materials in the improvement of the existing building stock.

However, circular building technology still faces a maturity gap, between theory and practice. Proven maturity, through a system of performance guarantees and liabilities, has been found key to the uptake of newly developed technologies like Circular Building Technologies.

During this symposium, different stakeholders in the process of making our built environment circular will present their views and work in this field to answer the joint question: how can we close the maturity gap of Circular Building Technology?
